Our speaker is Derek Bailey, Chairman of the Inter-Tribal Council of Ottawa and Chippewa Indians. Chairman Bailey is the fifth Chairman since the Grand Traverse Band was federally reaffirmed on May 27, 1980, and the youngest in the tribe's history. Chairman Bailey has a Master's Degree in Social Work and has extensive experience in clinical and administrative behavioral health. President Obama recently appointed Chairman Bailey to the National Advisory on Indian Education.

Chairman Bailey will lead us on a tour of the Eyaawing Museum and discuss the history, culture and language of the Grand Traverse Band. The Grand Traverse Band also owns the Grand Traverse Resort, Turtle Creek Casino, Leelanau Sands Casino and is one of the largest public employers in the area.

If you are interested in Indian lore, feel the slots are not paying off frequently enough or want to hear Chairman Bailey's thoughts on representing the 1<sup>st</sup> District in the U.S. Congress, you'll want to attend this meeting.

The Museum is on M-22, 19 miles north of the corner of M-72 & M-22 (Tom's Market) and across the street from the Leelanau Sands Casino.

## **WALK IN THE WOODS**

**Saturday, October 8, 11:00 AM**

Join us on October 8th for our second Walk in the Woods of the season. We are modifying our plans from the September newsletter slightly and will be walking the Skegemog Swamp Pathway. The Skegemog Swamp has been here since the glaciers receded and water levels dropped. The swamp flooded significantly when settlers built a dam with a head of water 7.5 feet high at Elk Rapids in the mid-1800's. The level of Lake Skegemog did not rise that much, but it rose enough to inundate the extensive backwater slough. The trail starts out with 0.5 mile on an abandoned railroad bed through a predominately beech forest, then crosses a small bridge and moves onto another 0.5 mile of wooden boardwalk which winds through a beautiful cedar swamp, crossing a small creek and ending at the east end of Skegemog Lake. The boardwalk/trail leads to a 16 ft. high observation tower that provides a beautiful view of Skegemog Lake and its surrounding wetlands. With binoculars we may see egrets or great blue herons, or even bald eagle or osprey. Other wildlife occasionally seen include otters, mink and beavers. By early October the colors should be beautiful.

This is a flat, easy walk, but wear long pants because the swamp grasses grow right up to the boardwalk. Depending on the weather, bug repellent may be advisable. Meet us at the parking area at 11:00 AM. We will plan lunch after our walk at Red Mesa Grill on US-31.

Directions to the parking area are:

From Traverse City, follow US-31 east to M-72 east. At the intersection of US-31 and M-72 in Acme, follow M-72 east for 10.2 miles to Hill Rd. (sign will say Rapid City). Turn left on Hill Rd. Hill Rd ends at Rapid City Rd (1.2 miles). Turn left and go approximately 2.4 miles to the trailhead sign and parking on the left.



## Congratulations to Derek J. Bailey Our October Speaker

Derek J. Bailey, Tribal Chairman of the Grand Traverse Band of Ottawa & Chippewa Indians, has received the 2011 Glen T. Miller Tribal Leadership Award from the Great Lakes Region of the Native American Fish and Wildlife Society. The award, named for the late Glen T. Miller, a Tribal Chairman of the Menominee Indian Tribe, was given to Tribal Chairman Bailey in recognition of his "outstanding leadership on natural resource issues, and the protection of Indian hunting and fishing rights on behalf of the Grand Traverse Band of Ottawa and Chippewa Indians." Tribal Chairman Bailey was sworn in as Tribal Chairman of the Grand Traverse Band on December 11, 2008. He is the fifth Chairman since the Grand Traverse Band was federally reaffirmed in May 1980, and the youngest in the Tribe's history.
